What is Primary PE and Sport Premium?

The Primary PE and Sport Premium is funding designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Department for Education's Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium: "ALL pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport." The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective: To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

The focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision (above) that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding. It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

At Pictor Academy the funding has clearly made this impact as reflected in the timetabled activities proffered to pupils and the participation involved.

Premium Impact

Here at Pictor we are passionate about health and well-being. Our school day starts with wake-up-shake-up sessions. We have a cycle track and bikes that are used through the week.

We are constantly looking to improve our playground and leisure activities through purchasing new equipment, the highlight this year being a fully accessible roundabout.

We allow family access to our large bespoke playground during school holidays and all facilities are utilised by our extended school in through the Pictor Hub. Our teachers also work closely with physiotherapy services and families to ensure individual pupils are active beyond the school day.

Rebound therapy is an example of a specialist input that we have invested in staff training and time for pupils benefit. The school seeks to widen pupil's experience but also embed engagement in physical activity across the curriculum. Pupils benefit from morning and afternoon playtimes. All classes have direct access to outside play areas from their classrooms.

The pupils are encouraged to participate in many varied sports and we buy specialist coaches in for swimming lessons, yoga, Kurling, football, dance and to teach PE in partnership with class teachers.

We also use the sports premium to buy into the Trafford Sports Partnership who are very inclusive and allow our pupils to compete and participate in competitive events across the year. We have a kitted out school football team who play friendlies with other schools.

The ethos of participation, health and well-being is modelled by the staff who join in and lead the pupils, we have a staff football team and even a teacher running the London Marathon 2017.

The sports premium has allowed sport and PE to flourish further and add breadth to all we can offer our pupils. We intend to further build up our provision and are very conscious that more specialist resources such as the inclusive roundabout will be required as our school further embraces pupils with more profound difficulties.



2017-2018 Sports Premium Costings

Plans Beyond this year

We are using the sports premium very much to get our pupils active. Most of the funding is used for leisure pursuits that the children can pursue in the future. We always look at sustainability as our start-point. So our staff could pick up the mantle with guidance and funded input within the school budget remit.
